A link will be sent early next week.



Year Two were delighted when **Kit from class 5** brought in the book '**Finding Winnie**' written by Lindsay Mattick.





This week in **class 21**, we have been consolidating our knowledge of **doubling in Maths**! The children used objects to support them with doubling and recorded their learning as a sum. They were then able to quickly recall double facts.

In **Class 20** we have been learning to double! We have been using a variety of **manipulatives** to help us, here we are using **Numicom** to double then record.




